The Tobacco Fee/Tax Increase – Our Take

A lot of ink has been spilled recently regarding the new 75-cent per pack charge on cigarettes, and the doubling of the tobacco distributor surcharge on cigars and other tobacco products. In our view, much of the discussion has been beside the point.

The new charge on tobacco products is clearly a tax increase. Fees are charged to defray the cost to government of providing a specific service to a group of people, not to fund the general running of government. That is certainly not the case with the new tobacco “health impact fee,” which was raised in order to increase general government spending. To add insult to injury, advocates of the tax increase claimed that tobacco users do not pay their way for the government services they consume – a position that has no basis in fact. According to the liberal Brookings Institution, tobacco users already paid taxes and fees equaling 300% of the costs their behavior imposed on society.

Of course, the most important point is lost in this debate. For almost 15 years Minnesota has been slowly moving in the right direction on taxes. While still among the highest-taxed states in the nation, lawmakers have been reducing income taxes and trying to get a handle on property taxes. With the passage of the “health impact fee” and the coming increases in property taxes to fund more government, taxes and government spending are once again moving in the wrong direction.

VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

MINNESOTA STATE SENATE

(SJ = Senate Journal Page #)

- 1. REJECT \$400 MILLION TAX INCREASE.** (SJ 613) The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject the HHS spending bill which included a 75 cent per pack cigarette tax increase, and doubled the taxes on other tobacco products (passed 60-6)
- 2. REJECT \$1.4 BILLION TAX INCREASE.** (SJ 2519) The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject the highest income tax rate in the nation (passed 35-28)
- 3. DON'T RAISE GAS PRICES.** (SJ 2857) The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this plan to increase the gas tax by 50% (passed 36-31)
- 4. DON'T INCREASE THE WORKFORCE TAX.** (SJ 2301) The taxpayer friendly vote was to oppose increasing the workforce development fee on businesses (failed 24-37)
- 5. KILL NORTHSTAR RAIL.** (SJ 179) The taxpayer friendly vote was to eliminate funding for the wasteful Northstar Rail project in the bonding bill (failed 6-57)
- 6. OPPOSE \$1 BILLION BONDING BILL.** (SJ 182) The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this pork-filled bonding bill which included funding for everything from a Shakespeare festival in Winona to a multicultural center in Gaylord (passed 57-7)
- 7. PROTECT MINNESOTA JOBS.** (SJ 237) The taxpayer friendly vote was to oppose raising the state minimum wage, which destroys jobs (passed 37-28)
- 8. STOP THE FOOD-FOR-OIL SCANDAL.** (SJ 273) The taxpayer-friendly vote was to oppose mandating a doubling of ethanol content in our gasoline from 10 to 20 percent (passed 54-12)
- 9. ELIMINATE GOVERNMENT PRICE CONTROLS.** (SJ 2870) The taxpayer-friendly vote was to eliminate government price controls which force gas stations to sell gas at 8 cents per gallon above wholesale cost (passed 35-30)
- 10. PROHIBIT TEACHER STRIKES DURING SCHOOL YEAR.** (SJ 2454) The taxpayer-friendly vote was to prohibit school teachers from striking during the school year (failed 29-37)
- 11. LET CONVICTS REPAY SOCIETY.** (SJ 2321) The taxpayer-friendly vote was to allow non-violent offenders to clean up ditches along highways (passed 49-15)

MINNESOTA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

(HJ = House Journal Page #)

- 1. REJECT \$400 MILLION TAX INCREASE.** (HJ 148) The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject the HHS spending bill which included a 75 cent per pack cigarette tax increase, and doubled the taxes on other tobacco products (passed 88-40)
- 2. DON'T RAISE TAXES ON MINNESOTA BUSINESSES.** (HJ 3918) The taxpayer friendly vote was to kill this proposal to raise taxes on Minnesota-based corporations by \$230 million (failed 67-67)
- 3. DON'T RAISE GAS PRICES.** (HJ 3979) The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this plan to increase the gas tax by 50% (passed 68-66)
- 4. REFORM THE TAX CODE.** (HJ 785) The taxpayer friendly vote was to support this bill which eliminates the marriage penalty, expands the education tax credit, and gives citizens the right to vote on property tax increases (passed 80-53)
- 5. NO NEW SPENDING.** (HJ 1271) The taxpayer friendly vote was to oppose this proposal to raise state spending by an additional \$358 million (failed 61-66)
- 6. KILL NORTHSTAR RAIL.** (HJ 592) The taxpayer friendly vote was to eliminate funding for the wasteful Northstar Rail project in the bonding bill (failed 29-104)
- 7. PROTECT MINNESOTA JOBS.** (HJ 3417) The taxpayer friendly vote was to oppose raising the state minimum wage, which destroys jobs (passed 84-50)
- 8. STOP THE FOOD-FOR-OIL SCANDAL.** (HJ 3290) The taxpayer-friendly vote was to oppose mandating a doubling of ethanol content in our gasoline from 10 to 20 percent (passed 91-43)
- 9. DON'T BAN SUDAFED.** (HJ 2598) The taxpayer-friendly vote was to reject this nanny-state legislation which bans all over-the-counter sales of cold pills containing pseudoephedrine such as Sudafed and Actifed (passed 115-19)
- 10. NO CHEESEBURGER LAWSUITS.** (HJ 4751) The taxpayer-friendly vote was to promote personal responsibility by protecting Minnesota businesses from frivolous obesity lawsuits (passed 75-59)
- 11. GIVE CITIZENS MORE VOICE IN GOVERNMENT.** (HJ 1972) The taxpayer friendly vote was to allow citizens to enact laws through an "initiative and referendum" process (passed 68-65)
- 12. LET CONVICTS REPAY SOCIETY.** (HJ 3317) The taxpayer-friendly vote was to allow non-violent offenders to clean up ditches along highways (passed 84-48)

BONUS POINTS (HOUSE & SENATE)

- CO-SPONSORED "TAXPAYER SATISFACTION SURVEY" BILL.** (5 points) (Senate File 1455/House File 1660) Would force a local referendum anytime local governments want to increase general property tax levies

TAXPAYER PROTECTION PLEDGE (HOUSE & SENATE)

- SIGNED PLEDGE.** (5 points for HONORING pledge) "I, _____, pledge to the taxpayers of the _____ district of the state of Minnesota, and to the people of this state that I will oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes"
- BROKE PLEDGE.** (-10 points) Broke pledge by voting in favor of the \$400 million tobacco tax increase
